# **Profile of Speakers**

Dr. Vittorio Zanon is a social worker. He works at the Verona Municipality City Office (Italy) for Human Trafficking victims, in collaboration with the with the project NAVe Network Antitraffiking of Veneto Region (<a href="http://www.progettonave.it/">http://www.progettonave.it/</a>). He is a social worker since 2000 and he has been dealing with immigration issues for almost 20 years. He was President of the Council of Social Workers of Veneto Region and is a founding member and current President of the cultural association ASit Social Service on the Internet (<a href="https://www.servizi-osociale.com">www.servizi-osociale.com</a>)

Sr. Patricia Ebegbulem, Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Louis. She became involved in anti-Human Trafficking and Women Issues in 1996 when she was the National President of the Nigeria Conference of Women religious 1996 – 2002. In this capacity, she with her Executive founded the Committee for the Support of the Dignity of Women (COSUDOW), a Network which is in the forefront of combating human trafficking. Sr. Patricia is the coordinator of the Bakhita Centre (Lagos) and of the Thalita Kum network (International network of Consecrated Life against trafficking in persons) in Nigeria. Bakhita Centre is an initiative for protecting and rehabilitating young women victims of prostitution and human trafficking when they return to Nigeria. The Bakhita Villa project in Lagos offers assistance, counselling and vocational training to help trafficking survivors reintegrate into society.
